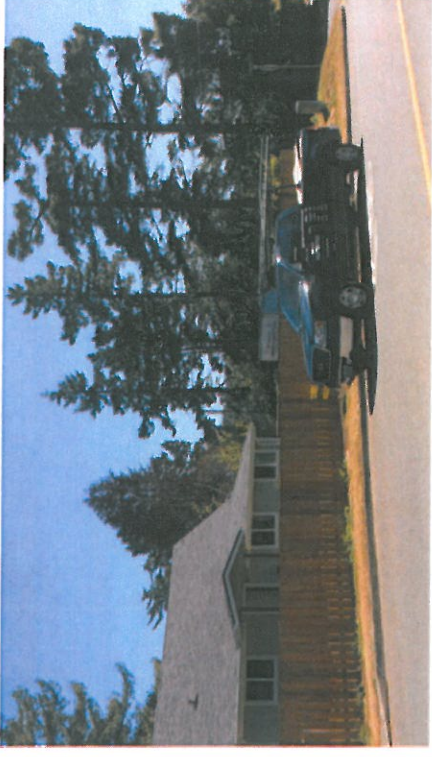


Entering our neighborhoods from 126 onto Spruce there's a large truck parked on 9th Street next to the 5' fence that goes all the way around the entire property. Then there's another truck often parked on Spruce blocking the bike path (and the city's sign). Both advertising a handyman business.
