CALL TO ORDER - ROLL CALL - PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

City staff will present proposed amendments to Florence City Code Title 4, Chapter 4 (Flood Damage Prevention), required by FEMA to maintain compliance with the National Flood Insurance Program and the Endangered Species Act. The code amendments are designed to protect floodplain habitat and achieve "no net loss" of beneficial floodplain functions, such as fill, impervious surfaces, and tree cover. This is an opportunity to learn and ask questions about the proposed amendments and how it may affect your property and other properties. No formal public testimony will be taken. The City will be holding formal public hearings on the proposed amendments at later dates, including June 10.
