



What is COAR?

- Part of the Aviation System Action Program (ASAP) that was established in 2015
- Funded by fuel tax on AV Gas and Jet Fuel (2 cents per gallon)
- 50% of the fuel tax increase goes towards COAR
- Assists airports with match requirements for FAA Airport Improvement Program (AIP) grants
- Provides grant funds for emergency preparedness
- Provides grant funds for services critical or essential to aviation; aviation-related business development; and airport development for local economic benefit (signage and marketing)

What is an AWOS?

- Automated Weather Observation System (AWOS)
- Reports weather information to pilots
- Located on east side of Airport near Airport Office



Background

- Existing AWOS constructed in 2001
- Unit has reached end of its design life
- Some equipment no longer supported by manufacturer and repair parts are no longer available



New AWOS

- Will be AWOS 3-PT
- Altimeter, Wind, Temperature, Dew Point, Density Altitude, Visibility, Cloud/Ceiling Data, Precipitation Sensor, & Thunderstorm/Lightning Reporting Capabilities
- Design will include siting study, but may end up in same location as existing

Yearly Non Primary Entitlements (FAA funding) is \$150,000 per year

*Funding from FAA, but will also contain State Apportionment or Discretionary dollars

Possible projects in 2025/2026 include a Taxiway Safety Area project located east of Taxiway A to eliminate flooding potential.


Staff Recommendation



CDBG EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

- CDBG Funding – through U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development
- Business Oregon provided \$1,750,000 of CDBG Funding for Communities impacted by COVID-19
- All CDBG Projects must meet one of three national objectives:
 - The proposed activities must benefit low- and moderate-income individuals.
 - The activities must aid in the prevention or elimination of slums or blight.
 - **There must be an urgent need that poses a serious and immediate threat to the health or welfare of the community.**

GRANT PROPOSAL

- Provide Scholarships for the Environmental Services Aide (ESA) program through LCC
 - Two Tracks: Full Course or Quick Course
 - Full Course (18-hours) – Designed for students who wish to enter the healthcare field
 - Quick Course (8-hours) – Designed for students in the restaurant, retail, and hospitality fields
 - Up to 150 scholarships for Florence workforce members
- Provide Personal Protective Equipment for students who complete the ESA program

TIMELINE & NEXT STEPS

Timeline:

- **June 22, 2020** – Council Approved Grant Application
- **August 26, 2020** – Staff Completed Grant Application
- **September 23, 2020** – Notified of Approval of Grant
- **October 5, 2020** – City Council Acceptance of Grant (Hopefully!)

Next Steps:

- Sign Contract with Business Oregon
- Advertise Program / Public Outreach
 - Radio / newspaper ads
 - Florence Four / City of Florence newsletter
 - Social Media posts
 - WorkSource Lane
 - Florence Area Chamber of Commerce
 - High Schools
- Execute Scholarship Program

HOW TO RECEIVE SCHOLARSHIP

- Apply for Scholarship – Quick Form
- Once Accepted – Student will receive coupon code from City of Florence to enroll in LCC's ESA Program
- Once Completed – Student will give City of Florence proof and student will receive PPE allotment
- Only Scholarships for up to 150 people – depending on what program students want to complete


