

### Staff Recommendation

Staff finds that the proposed application meets the requirements of City Code with the conditions as follows, and recommends approval of the application.

### Conditions of Approval

- No modifications of approved design- if mural is modified, CD Director or Planning Commission approval will be required
- 2. "Agreement of Acceptance" submittal to Community Development Department.
- 3. Written part of submittal requires a sign permit.

### Conditions of Approval

- 4. Provide contract or other obligation to complete the mural
- 5. Provide statement that the mural and individual elements are original works of art.
- 6. Contact with Community Dev. when mural is complete and ready to inspect
- 7.Approval expires within 12 months if not inspected- if expires, needs new Permit

### Informational

- 1. One-time extension of 12 months may be requested.
- 2. Thirty (30) days before removal of the mural owner must submit notice to the Community Development Department.

### Modifications

 CC 21 24 MUR 01 to CC 21 17 MUR 01

### Alternatives

- 1. Approve the mural permit as proposed
- 2. Review and make changes to proposed mural permit
- 3. Continue the Public Hearing to a date certain or leave written record open if more information is needed.
- Deny the application and change the findings and resolution citing reason(s) for denial

- 3. Posted a Public Hearing Notice in the Siuslaw News on August 18th, 2021.
- 4. Reviewed the street closure application for compliance with City code.



To the Florence City Council:

RE: Hiroshima Peace Tree

The Environmental Management Advisory Committee is asking the City Council to approve an application for a Hiroshima Peace Tree. I would like to briefly add a little bit of background about the Peace Trees.

After the bombing of Hiroshima there were noted several ginkgo trees that miraculously survived the bombing. The seeds of these trees, called "hibakumaku" or "Hiroshima Peace Trees," have been propagated ever since. Several years ago, the One Sunny Day Initiative in Medford, Oregon obtained some of these seeds, grew the trees to seedlings, and has made the trees available through the Oregon Department of Forestry Urban and Assistance Program and Oregon Community Trees. Michael Titmus, who was instrumental in having Florence become a Tree City, first proposed applying for a Peace Tree, but never had a chance to complete the application. EMAC decided to complete the application and present it to the City Council.

Not everyone who applies for a tree will actually receive one. Although there is no charge for the tree itself, one of the conditions of receiving a tree is that there will be some type of dedication ceremony. This is certainly open to discussion, but a dedication during Rhododendron Days seemed like a good time. If we do receive a tree, it would be nice to invite a representative from our sister city, Yamagata, Japan, to attend.

2020 marked the 75<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the bombing of Hiroshima and the end of World War II. These trees are a living link to those historic times. I hope the City Council will approve the application for the Hiroshima Peace Tree.
