

**CITY OF FLORENCE  
RESOLUTION NO. 16, SERIES 2021**

**A Resolution Authorizing the City of Florence, Oregon to Apply for a Grant from the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department for Construction and Development of the Siuslaw Estuary Trail**

RECITALS:

1. The Oregon Parks and Recreation Department is accepting grant applications for the Recreational Trails Program.
2. The City of Florence desires to participate in this grant program to the greatest extent possible as a means of providing needed multi-use (pedestrian and bicycle) trail improvements for the Siuslaw Estuary Trail.
3. The Siuslaw Estuary Trail Visioning project was completed as part of the Siuslaw Estuary Partnership, a collaborative effort by the City of Florence and its federal, state, and local partners to protect and improve water quality and fish and wildlife habitat in the lower Siuslaw River Watershed.
4. City Council and staff members have identified the Siuslaw Estuary Trail as a priority need in the 2012 Florence Transportation System Plan; 1999 Florence Downtown Plan; Parks and Recreation Master Plan; and the Comprehensive Plan.
5. The City of Florence has available local matching funds to fulfill its share of obligation related to this grant application should the grant funds be awarded.
6. The City of Florence will provide adequate funding for ongoing operations and maintenance of this facility should the grant funds be awarded.

Based on these findings,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FLORENCE RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:


1. The City Council demonstrates its support for the submittal of a grant application to the Oregon Park and Recreation Department for Recreational Trails Program to construct and develop a trailhead and parking area; multi-use path; and connection to Quince Street as part of the Siuslaw Estuary Trail.
2. This Resolution takes effect immediately upon adoption.
