NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING

The Florence Planning Commission will hold a public hearing 5:30 p.m. on June 13, 2023, in the City Hall Chambers, located at 250 Hwy 101, to hear and consider the following matter:

Resolution PC 22 21 PUD 01 & Resolution PC 22 25 SUB 03— Myrtle Glenn — 37th and Oak: An application submitted by Mike Johnson, on behalf of the applicants William Johnson Construction, Inc and property owner David J. Bielenberg, for PC 22 21 PUD 01, preliminary planned unit development (PUD) and tentative subdivision plan. The overall proposal is to subdivide property into 25 individual lots and one street on 3.13 acres of property as shown on the Lane County Assessor's Map # 18-12-22-11, TL 01200 and 0.21 acres as shown on Lane County Assessor's Map 18-12-22-11 TL 00200 located approximately 770 feet west of the Hwy 101 and 37th St intersection and approximately 610 feet north of the 35th St and Oak St intersection. The proposal includes extending 37th St west. The 37th St right-of-way proposal includes sidewalks and on-street parking on both sides and n emergency vehicle turn around on the south west portion of the street. The applicant is requesting a variance for decreased lot size to provide additional on-site parking and decrease units per acre due to the constraints of the slope on the western portion of the property.

Written testimony received prior to June 5, 2023, can be addressed within the staff report; however, written testimony will be accepted until June 13, 2023, at 3:30 PM. Comments should include a mailing address. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter or failure to provide sufficient specificity to afford the decision-maker an opportunity to respond precludes appeal based on that issue. The hearing will be conducted in accordance with Florence City Code Title 2, Chapter 10.

Applicable criteria, a copy of the application, documents and evidence submitted by or on behalf of the applicant, and other related materials are available for inspection or for purchase at the City of Florence Planning Department, located at 250 Highway 101, Florence, OR, or may be found on the City's website under "Planning & Zoning." The staff report is available for inspection 7 days prior to the hearing and will be provided at reasonable cost.
