UPDATED PUBLIC MEETINGS PROCEDURES – COVID-19

Given executive orders from Governor Brown concerning COVID-19 and social distancing requirements, the City of Florence has established temporary procedures for public meetings in order to protect our volunteers, public and staff.

Planning Commission meetings shall not allow for verbal public comments on any item other than a mandatory public hearing. In person attendance is not allowed at Planning Commission meetings. Citizens wishing to express their views to the Planning Commission may do so by submitting written communications in one of the following ways:

- 1. Submit written comments via email to the Community Development Department at planningdepartment@ci.florence.or.us.
- Mail written comments to Florence City Hall Attn: Planning Commission, 250 Hwy 101, Florence, OR 97439
- 3. Drop off written comments to the City of Florence drop box located at Florence City Hall (250 Hwy 101) to the right of the main entrance.

Public Hearing Testimony: Those interested in providing testimony in a public hearing may do so via one of the following methods:

- 1. <u>Written Testimony:</u> Citizens are encouraged to provide testimony in writing prior to the meeting through one of the methods listed above. All written testimony received at least 2 hours prior to the Planning Commission meeting (July 14, 2020 at 3:30 p.m.) will be distributed to the Commissioners, posted on the City of Florence website, and made part of the record.
- 2. Participation via GoToWebinar: Those desiring to provide verbal testimony may participate in the meeting via the GoToWebinar platform. To do so, please complete a speaker's card online at https://www.ci.florence.or.us/bc-pc/request-address-planning-commission-speakers-card at least 1 hour prior to the meeting (July 14, 2020 at 4:30 p.m.). City staff will then contact the speaker to let them know the process to participate in the meeting.

Comments on Agenda Items: Written comments received regarding items on an upcoming Planning Commission agenda item will be distributed to the Planning Commission and made available to the public on the City of Florence's website either on the Thursday prior to the meeting, or at 4 p.m. on the meeting date, as long as they are received at least 2 hours prior to the meeting start time. In this way, comments received shall be considered by the Planning Commission during their decision-making process.

Comments on Items not on an Agenda: Comments on items that are not on an upcoming Planning Commission agenda will be forwarded to the Planning Commission for their consideration. This policy is planned to change effective July 28th.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEDURE

The Planning Commission must make its decision based on facts. Prior to the hearing, staff will identify the applicable substantive criteria which have also been listed in the staff report. These are the criteria

the Planning Commission must use in making its decision. All testimony and evidence must be directed toward these criteria or other criteria in the Plan or Land Use Regulations which you believe applies to the decision per ORS 197.763 (5). Failure to raise an issue accompanied by statements or evidence sufficient to afford the Planning Commission and parties involved an opportunity to respond to the issue may preclude an appeal based on that issue. Prior to the conclusion of the initial evidentiary hearing, any participant may request more time to present additional evidence, arguments or testimony regarding the application.

Copies of written testimony submitted for the hearing have been distributed to the Planning Commission. When testifying, if someone has made statements with which you agree, just state that you agree with those comments. You do not need to restate the previous comments.
