(5) Provide written testimony submitted in-person at the hearing.** <u>Note:</u> Written testimony not submitted at the hearing must be received at least 2 hours prior to the meeting (July 25, 2023 at 3:30 p.m.) in order to be distributed to the Planning Commission, posted to the City of Florence website, and made part of the record.

<u>Verbal Testimony:</u> Citizens wishing to express their view verbally may participate in the meeting at Florence City Hall or via GoToWebinar: <u>https://attendee.gotowebinar.com/register/6303386245281309272</u>. Testimony not submitted in compliance with the above procedures, will not be included in the record.

Testimony time limits:

- <u>Public Comments on items not on the agenda:</u> General public comments (on items not on the Planning Commission agenda) will be allowed at each Planning Commission meeting during the public comment agenda item. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all items. In practicality, this means no more than five (5) individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.
- 2. <u>Public Hearing Testimony</u>: Testimony on public hearing items will be allowed when a public hearing is held. Verbal comments will be allowed on public hearing items after staff has given their report and have allowed time for initial Commission questions. Written testimony will not be read into the record by staff
- 3. <u>Public Comments on Action Items</u>: Public Comments will be allowed on each action item on the Planning Commission agenda, except for land use decisions for which the public hearing is closed. Verbal comments will be allowed on action items after staff has given their report and have allowed time for initial Commission questions. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all comments on each

action item. In practicality, this means no more than five (5) individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.

PUBLIC HEARING PROCEDURE

The Planning Commission must make its decision based on facts. Prior to the hearing, staff will identify the applicable substantive criteria which have also been listed in the staff report. These are the criteria the Planning Commission must use in making its decision. All testimony and evidence must be directed toward these criteria or other criteria in the Plan or Land Use Regulations which you believe applies to the decision per ORS 197.763 (5). Failure to raise an issue accompanied by statements or evidence sufficient to afford the Planning Commission and parties involved an opportunity to respond to the issue may preclude an appeal based on that issue. Prior to the conclusion of the initial evidentiary hearing, any participant may request more time to present additional evidence, arguments or testimony regarding the application.
