ART EXPOSED REVISION FLORENCE

From now through December 15, 2023, at 9:59:59 (PT), the Florence Urban Renewal Agency and City of Florence Public Arts Committee are seeking vibrant, large-scale public art to go on Highway 101 as part of Art Exposed ReVision Florence 2024-2026. Artists are encouraged to submit unique sculptural pieces that demonstrate extraordinary creativity. These will go in six locations on Highway 101 between the Siuslaw River Bridge and the intersection with Highway 126.

Selected artists will be paid a \$1,500 stipend to display their art for a twoyear period, starting in April 2024. During this time, the art is available for sale. If a piece sells, the City of Florence retains 30% of the proceeds to reinvest in the Public Arts Program.

A popular public art program in Florence is moving uptown next spring. Chantelle Meyer is the Economic Development and Communications Analyst for the city. She says they've issued a "call-forartists" through December 15th for pieces that would be installed in April and remain in place for two vears.

SUBCOMMITTEE CHECK-INS OUTREACH & MARKETING

OUTREACH AND MARKETING

Start your Cannon Beach public art walking tour at the corner of Spruce and 2nd Street in front of the public restrooms.

● THE WAVE: This stonless-steel construction by Sharon Warmon Agnor is an ordern interpretation of waves featuring subtle colors. Looking across the street, take note of some of the artistic architectural details on the Information Center building. The chinney copie an appreving the notex hemeion art. Now proceed across 3nd street, then Spruce Street and walk north. Passing Northwest Splatery, you'll see ared metal taphere by Ivan McLean and the gallery doors are one of a kink creeted by glass artist: Duane bable. Lootinue north on Spruce, cross 3rd Street and continue to the corner of East 3rd 5t.

O WHALE RIBS: Lining the sidewalk in frant of the small public parking latit in an installation of weather rusted metal ribs with circular glass insets created by Nick Thomas Design Studio. Now follow East and Street easts at it turns 90 degrees left and becomes Fir Street, walking past the old Cannon Beach Elementury School, now Niccu' Park. Just before the bridge, walk west on the bark trail to the beach access at the edge of Ecold Creek.

WELCOME POLE: This wooden sculpture is inspired by the original Clataop-Neholem tribe who lived in a small village called N&Cu's along this creek bonk when Lewis and Clark's Corps of Discovery passed this way in 1806. This welcome pole was carved by native American artist Guy Capeema. Continue along the bark, trail through a small wooded area, emerging at Spruce Streec. Continue to the corner, turning right on 3rd Street and proceed to Whole Park where the street turns south to become Hermiok-Street.

O WHALE SCULPTURE: The focal point of this small point is a branze whale sculpture commemorating the visit of Lewis and Clark's Carps of Discovery in 1806 when they traveled to this area to find a whale that was reported to have washed ashror. Cark named the nearby creek Ecol, the native term for whale. Crass Hemilock Street and walk south as you enter the heart of downtown Cannon Beach. Turn left up the pathway of Coastal Yams where the courtyard features a brane sculpture of a seal by renowned Northwest sculptor Georgia Garber. Pass through the courtyard the south (at Windermere Real Estate) to find a calorful mural by Rumi Tsuda depicting Cannon Beach scenes. Return to Heinock Street and use the crosswalk to continue south. Check out the sculptural fountain in the courtyard of The Landing complex and then continue, crossing West 11s Street where you can see the whimiscini, fantasy-like building that is home to Steidel Art. Now cross Hendock Street wolking east.

 A DELICATE BALANCE: The whimsical and colorful scupture can be seen just off the corner featuring stacked chickens and eggs by scupture Wayne Chabre. Walk north along the east side of Hemicak as you leave the core of the downtown commercial area and continue for an old mile to mildrown Carnon Beach to the corner of South Hemicak and Coolidge Americe

O TUFTED PUFFINS: A pair of bronze nuzzling Tufted Puffins was created by Northwest sculptor Georgia Gerber. Use the crosswalk across Hemlock Street toward the public restrooms.

CONTACT: The cut steel bright orange bench formed by two figures reaching toward each other was created by artist Alisa Looney.

WANT MORE? Two other pieces of public art are not on this wolking toru, build are worth finding. Falterman's Dance is a collection of three modern carried wooden totems by Steve Jannen located on Bast Sumet Boulward near Reservoir Bodd. In the northeast corner of the Tolovana Park wayside is a stone and metal sculpture, Solmon Journey, by Native American artist Lillion Pitt and Aron Loveitt.

WANT MORE: Two other pieces of public art are not on this walking tour, but are worth finding. Fisherman's Dance is a collection of three modern carved wooden totems by Steve Jensen located on East Sunset Boulevard near Reservoir Road. In the northeast corner of the Tolowand Beach State Recreation Site Parking Lot is a stone and metal Statte Recreation Site Parking Lot is a stone and metal Sulpture, Salman Journey, by Native American artist Lillian Pitt and Aaron Loveitt.




