- 1. <u>Written Testimony:</u> Citizens wishing to express their views to the Committee are encouraged to submit written testimony in one of the following ways:

  - c. Drop off written comments at Florence City Hall (250 Highway 101) during regular office hours (Monday through Friday 8 a.m. 4 p.m.) or at the City of Florence drop box located at Florence City Hall to the right of the main entrance.

**Note:** Written comments received at least 2 hours prior to the meeting will be distributed to the Committee, posted to the City of Florence website, and made part of the record.

- Verbal Testimony: Citizens wishing to express their views to the Committee may participate in the meeting inperson or via GoToWebinar. To do so, please complete a speaker's card online at <a href="https://www.ci.florence.or.us/bc-pac/public-arts-committee-speakers-card">https://www.ci.florence.or.us/bc-pac/public-arts-committee-speakers-card</a> at least 1 hour prior to the meeting. City staff will then contact the speaker to let them know the process to participate in the meeting.
  - a. Public Comments on items not on the agenda: General public comments (on items not on the agenda) will be allowed at each Committee meeting during the public comment agenda item. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all items. In practicality, this means no more than five individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.
  - b. Public Comments on Action Items: Public Comments will be allowed on each action item on the Committee agenda. Verbal comments will be allowed on action items after staff has given their report and have allowed time for initial Committee questions. Comments will be limited to three (3) minutes per person, with a maximum of 15 minutes for all comments on each action item. In practicality, this means no more than five (5) individuals will be allowed to comment verbally. There is no limit on written public comments.

We will meet next on Monday, March 31, 2025, for our monthly meeting at 4:00 p.m. at Florence City Hall. We will be meeting in the City Council Chambers, either in person or through the GoToWebinar platform.

The meeting will begin with public comment. Then, we will jump into a discussion about Continuing Education.

In an effort to continue inspiring and educating each other and our community, the Public Arts Committee invites you to share Public Art that excites you! Presentations will be short and sweet, about 10/15mins long. You are welcome to create or bring visuals to the presentation. You are welcome to share about another location's public art program, share about a work of public art or something that relates to Public Art that enriches our knowledge. These presentations are to help enrich our understanding, encourage participation and engagement as well as further our community's understanding of Public Art.

What would we like to get out of our Continuing Education presentations? We will also fill out a sign up sheet to get us through the next season!


Following this, Staff will give an update on the completion of Art Exposed Old Town 2025-2027 sculpture installations, <a href="https://bit.ly/FlorenceArtExposed">https://bit.ly/FlorenceArtExposed</a>. Florence Public Works worked with Staff and the artists to install the works throughout February and March. We will also discuss the Art Exposed Old Town Art Walk and when we want to show our project to the community. While marketing has already started, the committee selected Saturday, April 26, as our day, with an even split on a morning and afternoon walk. Do we want to do both?

Next, we will take a look at not only our Public Arts Committee meeting dates, but also how our projects will fill our agendas. With Art Exposed happening each year now on a rotating basis — Art Exposed ReVision in even years, Art Exposed Old Town in odd years — we want to prioritize attention on our other areas of interest. These are guided by our subcommittees, Art Exposed, Inventory & Maintenance, and Public/Private Partnerships.

Speaking of partnerships, the Port of Siuslaw is finalizing installation of "Golden/Yellowstone," the sculpture by artist Rick True that the Port purchased from the City of Florence in January. The original "fish" is now up at the Port of Siuslaw boardwalk overlooking both Bay Street and the Siuslaw River. Port leadership is contemplating how they can work with the Public Arts Committee to promote the Port's current artwork and possibly sponsor a location of Art Exposed. The Committee will begin discussion on the feasibility of a partnership with the Port, and direct Staff and the Public/Private Partnership Subcommittee on that work.

After this, the Subcommittees can provide check ins before we conclude the meeting with updates on arts and culture related activities.   - May Installation and celebration of Art Exposed
